
had to go, and luck would have it AirVenture 2025 was going on that week.










# **Reno British Motor Show 2025**

The convoy rolled out, rumbling down old US 395 south, then zipping onto I-580 toward Carson City, with dreams of motoring glory. Group A, feeling like Formula 1 champs, peeled out first—only to get stuck in a traffic jam where 395 fizzles out, probably caused by a rogue tumble-

# **Knight Foundry Tour**

The instant my wife, Terry and I saw the little bronze bear on the shelf in the gift shop at the Knight Foundry, we knew we had to have it.

You see, the mantel over our wood stove at our house at Lake Tahoe is covered with little bears. To be honest there are bears all over the house. A couple of years ago we even had live bears in our house but that is another story.

What led us to purchase this bronze bear was a three-day RBCC road trip to Plymouth, CA earlier this month. Forty car club members met in Reno, NV on Tuesday morning for a trip through the Sierra Nevada. Our route took us through Washoe



Valley into Genoa, NV with a stop at Caples Lake near Kirkwood Ski Resort for a picnic lunch. We arrived at the Shenandoah Inn in Plymouth with only one breakdown.

That evening we had a wonderful taco bar buffet dinner by the pool and enjoyed the camaraderie that owners of little British cars share.

On Wednesday morning we went wine tasting in Amador County's Shenandoah Valley. We visited the Amador Flower Farm and Deaver Vineyards and had a picnic lunch in the shade of huge oak trees next to a pond crowded with Koi fish and turtles.

At the wine tasting at Deaver Vineyards my daughter, Kristy and I found a delightful sparkling peach-mango wine that was as close to eating a ripe peach as I could imagine. We both bought a bottle.

In the afternoon we tasted wine at the Sobon Estates and the Shenandoah Vineyards. Sobon Estates is one of the oldest wineries in California founded in 1856. Sobon Estates is also the site of the Shenandoah Valley Museum housing hundreds of early home, agriculture, and winemaking items from the area. There are over 46 vineyards in Amador County and our trip planners chose well.



That evening we had a catered tri-tip and chicken buffet dinner by the pool with bottles of wine showing up on every table.

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
On Thursday we checked out of our hotel and took a short drive to Sutter Creek, CA for a tour of the Knight Foundry, America's last water-powered foundry.

Did I mention it is hot in wine country this time of year? Due to the heat a much smaller group of eleven RBCC members made the trip from Plymouth to Sutter Creek for the tour.

The Knight Foundry was established in 1873 by Samuel Knight. The foundry, 19th-century technology of belt driven

The foundry and machine shop are massive and are spread over several buildings. The two-hour tour was given by docents who volunteer their time working the foundry and providing

maintenance and preservation. I found their presentation very informative.



main waterwheel which is currently run by electricity. I thought the waterwheel was on the small side

considering it was powering the entire facility through a system of leather belts. Watching the spider's web of conveyer belts in action amazed me.

Water does not currently run the waterwheel due to environmental issues. The docents said that one little waterwheel can produce over 100 hp

and that once approved by the EPA, a turn of a single valve will start the water flowing again.

The Knight Foundry stands out as the only foundry in the world to have manufactured a waterwheel with the water cups forged onto and with the wheel. All other waterwheels had to have the water cups fastened to the wheel.
