Drive Your Dream Ginger, a 1966 AH Sprite Mark III Covid 19 car

In early 2020 the governor of Nevada announced that my wife, Terry, and I were to be separated from our families and friends due to Covid-19. I decided then that Terry and I needed a project to keep us busy as we would be spending a lot of time together and at home. Steve, a friend of a friend living in the Los Angeles, CA area had a 1966 Austin Healey Sprite Mark III in dire need of restoration, rust-free, and for sale.

In May of 2020, Terry and I hooked up our car trailer and drove from Reno, NV to Glendora, CA to pick up the Sprite. Steve had a long history with the car, had done a lot of mechanical work on it, and had replaced the 1098cc engine with a 1275cc and a ribbed transmission. Steve ended up owning the Sprite in a 'Mechanics Lien' deal so there was no clear California title which was a real problem for Nevada DMV. The Sprite was also missing a lot of pieces, but Steve found them in his garage.



Over the course of several months, Terry and I spent our time together working on the Sprite. We tore the car apart and had the metal soda blasted, primered, and painted. The Sprite was originally green and our daughter, Kristy, picked "our" green for us from a Canada Dry Ginger Ale can. That's why we call her "Ginger Ale".

Due to the worldwide Covid related work stoppage parts became difficult to find and even longer to get delivered. Reordering backordered parts also became common. We tried to order a replacement wiring harness for the Sprite but wiring harnesses were backordered for months. So, we laid the harness out on our patio, tore it apart, and rebuilt it replacing stiff and wrong color wires and bad end connectors. We wrapped the "new" harness with harness wrap, taped it up and it worked as advertised.

The wheels, roll bar, and most of the cockpit metal work, including the dash were powdercoated black. We cleaned and polished each chrome part and were able to reuse almost all the original pieces.



We had the seats upholstered but found the frames to be out of a bigger car and the finished seats turned out too large for the Spite. We replaced the seats using seats from our Bugeye Sprite and gave the expensive, newly upholstered, leather seats to our grandsons to use as game room chairs and they love them.

The tach and gas gauge had to be sent to Nisonger Instruments in New York for conversion to negative ground. A new speedometer was installed along with a new radiator, new master cylinder, new K&N air filters, new starter, new steering wheel, new tonneau cov-

er, new tires, new carpet kit, new horns, new leaf springs and rebuilt shocks in the back, new "lowered" coil springs and all new steering components in the front, new bushings, seals and grommets through-out the car and a new front anti-sway bar rounded out the restoration.

Terry and I spent the better part of a year working on the Sprite. We had a lot of just-thetwo-of-us time, and this little car gave us a goal that kept us busy.

Two and a half years after the restoration we were finally able to complete the job by adding a brand new, but then unobtainable, winged Austin Healey logo bonnet badge. "Ginger" recently took second place in the Spridget Class at the Reno British Motor Show 2023. She looks and drives great and gave Terry and me a project that will not be forgotten.
