Getting To Know You

Hi, this is John McTigue. I joined the RBCC in January of 2018 shortly after taking delivery of my 68 MGB. I had never owned an MG before, but had always been what you might call 'MG-curious', so in the fall of 2017 and after some shopping on line, I decided to take the plunge. Once I got the car, in December of that year, I began to fear I'd gotten in over my head. The car looked great,



but had some issues. Leaking gas tank, Intermittent starting, battery not charging, badly worn front tires, vibration above 45 mph, noisy rough running engine, gauges not working, etc., etc.

So I contacted the RBCC looking for some advice. I talked to Andy Killian first who referred me to Peter Gulash who invited me over to his house to talk about MGs and old British cars in general. With the advice from Peter, I ordered some parts on line and began tinkering. The leaking gas tank was a bad sending unit seal, the (main) electrical problems were a loose battery connection and a bad voltage regulator. Mark Thomas came over and showed me how to adjust the valves and set the timing. I set the toe-in using the string method, and got new tires after finding a shop that had the adapter to balance the center-lock wheels. After lots of tinkering and installing some new parts here and there, the car runs really well and is great fun to drive.

I want to thank the members of the RBCC for all advice and support I've gotten since joining, and I'm looking forward to more adventures with you all down the road.
