Drive Your Dream

Dr. David Doyle's 1970 TVR Vixen S2

Most people are not familiar with the TVR nameplate, mainly because they were never sold in the US as a complete car. A small number were shipped to the US as rolling chassis without a drive train. You may have heard of the TVR Griffith. Griffith was a car dealer from New York who imported TVR rolling chassis and installed Ford V8 engines. By doing that the car was considered a kit car and was able to get around the US emissions and safety standards.

TVRs are relatively rare, which is one of the main reasons I bought the car as I like cars that are seldom seen. My car is a 1970 TVR Vixen S2, one of only 600 produced in left-hand drive. It is considered a grey market car. It was purchased by the previous owner from Canada and used only as a track car until it was 25 years old and could be licensed for the street.



I purchased the car in 2002 and partially restored it by doing engine upgrades, chassis repair, and replacing the interior. TVRs are built on a welded tubular space frame chassis with a double wishbone coil over suspension and fiberglass body. Another key reason I bought this car is that they are extremely lightweight, mine weighing only 1617 lbs wet. The lightweight and balance in the car results in great handling and braking. The car was originally powered by a Ford Kent 1600 crossflow engine producing 130 hp. I say originally because, on my way to the NW Classic car rally, I tore a hole in the oil pan and toasted the engine. I am currently installing a new engine and 5-speed and am hoping to have it completed for The Reno British Motor Show on September 28th. I can't wait to be driving it again!

Tech - Seat Belts - Be Safe!

I am restoring a Triumph TR 6. It required replacing the seat belts. Looking for a solution, I found SeatBeltRestore.com who fixed me up. As part of my research, I found lots of on line information on their website that I wanted to point others toward who might need a solution to aged or failed seat belts, buckles or retractor mechanisms in their British Cars. Go to their website for the complete text. Here are my excerpts that I hope you find useful:

- Use only the highest quality parts (webbing, buckles, retractors, fasteners) in seat belt restoration
- Do a thorough visual inspection of webbing. If it is less than pristine, beware.
- Trouble signs frayed or worn webbing, tears on the seat belt, warps which make it difficult to buckle.


