Tech Session Saturday, October 18th

Restarting A Long Silent Jensen Healey Engine

On a nice fall day about a dozen RBCC members gathered at Andy Hebert and Shelley

Brown's workshop. The day's objective was to try and start a two-liter, double overhead cam, four valve per cylinder, Lotus engine which is installed in Andy's Jensen Healey parts car. This car truly looks the part of a "Parts Car" with years of mold and soil in the interior, lots of patina revealing the layers in the paint and an engine wearing its fair share of dirt from its previous life.

One group led by Steve Brooks tackled the carbs giving them a cursory inspection and then reassembling them. Fuel was supplied from a one-gallon plastic gas can

with a small electric fuel pump installed in the delivery line. Group two led by Andy checked that the engine would turn, cleaned the plugs, and set the distributor timing as it seemed to be 180 degrees from where it should be. And I think both groups connected a fresh battery to the electrical system which was installed to the point that it would deliver power to the ignition and the starter.

The key was turned and lo and behold, the starter cranked and the engine turned. It had a solid starting action, but no fire in the cylinders. It would crank and crank but not fire. Ever reliable starting fluid and parts cleaner were sprayed into the carbs, but still no action. The either smell was strong enough that I was afraid David Doyle might try to drill on my teeth! But he resisted the urge. The spark was checked again and there was strong spark available. That left one prime suspect, ignition timing.

So further adjustments were made. The key was turned once again and this time the engine kicked back on the starter. The engine was trying to fire. After a few more timing adjustments, IT STARTED! And not just started but revved strongly. As the exhaust heated up, years of old oil generated plenty of smoke from the hot exhaust manifold.

Once final adjustments were made to the timing, it would start reliably, rev strong without misfiring and even idle smoothly! An amazing result from an engine that had not seen any

love for years. Since it had no cooling system installed we had to end our fun before the heat did any damage.

Congratulations to the tech team for another fun day and a successful one at that. Andy is not sure where the engine may end up. He mentioned putting it in his MG Midget! Now that will be a heck of a tech session.



AirBrush

Recently I acquired an airbrush, the fine finishing tool for painting. I wish I had it when I was painting the bottom of the car; despite its small capacity it really would have been perfect. Today I used it to paint a small part that was neglected in the great paint, plus a series of nuts and bolts that will give it that finished look once installed. It connects directly to the compressor, or to an air hose. Run it at 40 PSI and it's basically a miniature spray gun. I mix the paint 1 to 3 with reducer; that seems to work pretty well. It comes with a little stand that you can attach to almost anything; I've got it on a scrap piece of lumber so I can set it anywhere.

It takes a bit of fine finger control, and you have to watch the overspray like any spray. I'm thinking at some point I might dispense altogether with rattle cans and use this!
